East Wall of St Nicholas Church

The work is well underway and the wall's structure is sounder than expected, especially that of the Chapel. There were some surprises found in the inspection holes of the Chancel wall. This included some infill of parts of a chalk window frame from when the Victorians replaced the originals. These pieces have been retained and are on show on the display table in the north aisle.

The roof and wall head work is nearing completion so the scaffolding will go this month. The drainage work is well underway, although the builders have struck some hard core around the tower as they try to re-install the drains to south of the church. This has come from when the Tower window was introduced by the Victorians. The north drains, like the south, will join onto the previous repairs of 2003. Meanwhile the south guttering is away for refurbishment while this is going on. The work, although slightly delayed, should be completed this month.

This year's Dinner Dance will be held on **Saturday 2nd December**. This is a very popular event where the Large Village Hall is transformed into an amazing wonderland and much fun and wine is had by all! Make this a date in your diary.

Sale of Alcohol at the Village Halls - update

The changes in the licensing laws have meant that the Village Hall needs to apply for a licence for the retail sale of alcohol. Our caretaker has undergone the necessary training and is licensed as a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) and our formal application to vary the Halls licence is now with WDC. The government has imposed this system on the basis of 'one size fits all' and this has proved a major headache for village halls, clubs and schools. The result is that we have to apply for a licence for every day of the week and for all hours in order to cover all possible requirements. The Halls' Committee would like to assure residents that the number of occasions (typically three times/month) when there is alcohol for sale on the site will remain unchanged. All these events are either private parties or ticketed events. There is positively no intention of running a pub or keeping a stocked bar.

At St. Nicholas Pre-school Playgroup our aim is for each child to be happy and confident, achieving their full potential in all areas of development – physical, emotional, intellectual and social – before starting full-time, compulsory education. The view from Shute End

Following the local elections for a third of the District Council seats. We started the new Council year on Thursday 18th May 2006. At a meeting of the full council the new Council Chairman, Angus Ross, was appointed, and Frank Browne was re-elected as Council Leader for another year. During the same meeting the Executive members, Chairmen and Vice-Chairman of Committees and Panels were agreed for the year. The political balance changed when the Liberal Democrats lost 3 seats to the Conservatives. We now have 40 Conservative members and 13 Liberal Democrats.
