Hurst Pantomime Group

The third production from the Hurst Pantomime Group, Aladdin, was a huge success. For this year's show, we had a new sound system, new scenery and some fantastic lighting. All four performances were sold out and the view of cast and crew (and, importantly, the audience!) was that the productions just keep getting better.

Of the funds that were raised, £500 has been donated to a fund related to the Royal Centre for Defence Medicine. The fund provides day-trips and events for injured military personnel who have returned from Iraq and Afghanistan and are awaiting treatment in NHS hospitals. This can often be long drawn out and the purpose of the fund is to combat low morale. Amounts were also donated to local organisations that helped make the pantomime so successful.

Local Flyball Teams go for Gold

The Brimblecombe Barkers Flyball Teams were successful in events around the country in 2006, culminating in a Gold Award for one of their dogs, Frisbee.

Veteran Tree Project

This worthwhile project to identify and map our oldest trees has now been launched. As reported in the last newsletter, Hurst's contribution was jointly funded by the Hurst Village Society and the Parish Council. The money goes towards training volunteers in surveying the trees and correlating the data collected in Wokingham District for eventual inclusion on a national database.

Maggie Sanderson is co-ordinating the Hurst effort and has divided the village up into areas to ensure that the whole parish is covered. The project will focus primarily on trees with a diameter of 1 metre plus. However in some species e.g. hawthorn or silver birch, a very old tree will have a much smaller diameter and these will also be noted.

Maggie will feed the Hurst results back to the project co-ordinator to be added to a database that will include all of Wokingham District's data. This vital work will enable these important trees to be monitored and protected.

SENIOR CITIZENS OPEN FORUM FOR THE NORTHERN PARISHES

Most of the January meeting was devoted to considering the report due to be presented to the WBC Executive on the future of adult social care services.

The government has decided that it will no longer increase the funding provided for social care services in line with the increasing number of older people. Local authorities are required to develop alternative services for managing the increasing demand for social care. Current expenditure can be maintained but growth has to be contained.

Later that day, the Executive decided that social care services should only be provided for people with 'critical' needs. People with 'substantial' or 'moderate' needs would require alternative sources for their care. Prevention services would aim to promote the health and general well being of people, to enable them to continue living in their own homes and reduce their need for more intensive forms of health care or a place in a care home.

The Council's response to the consultation should be available early in March and then the effectiveness of the consultation can be assessed.

The subject of the meeting on Thursday, 26 April will be **Addressing the Challenge of Retirement** given by Joanna Rowley of Retirement Solutions. If you are over 55, you are welcome to join us. The meeting will start at 2 pm.

Hurst Village Society General Committee meets every six weeks to discuss issues associated with planning, the environment, transport and other public services in the village that are related to the aims of the Society given below. The Committee is associated with running the annual Dinner Dance, working with the Parish and District Councils to protect the character of the village and organising fund-raising events such as Archery at the Hurst Horse Show. The HVS produces a Newsletter which is published at least four times a year, manages a village website **www.hvs.org.uk**, and publishes a Skills Register. The newsletter and website contain information about village events and activities other than those of the Village Society.

The aims of the Society include:

- to protect the physical character and rural environment
- to provide an independent focal point for the community
- to improve road safety in the village
- to encourage involvement in village activities
- to promote the use of amenities in the village
- to encourage a spirit of neighbourliness
- to foster communication between members of the community.

The General Committee consists of 15 members who elect their officers including: Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Secretary and Social Secretary. Other responsibilities include Planning, Environment, Health and Newsletter Editor. Each year a third of the committee members stand down and may offer themselves for re-election.

WOKINGHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL, 12 March 2007

The Council voted in September 2006 to petition Her Majesty the Queen to grant a charter conferring the status of borough upon the Wokingham district. On 9 March 2007, at the Mayor's Spring Civic Reception, the Council officially launched its new status.

This will bring benefits to the Council in terms of our public image. However, we have ensured that the cost of becoming a borough and subsequent name change is not significant. Borough Status means that the Chairman of the Borough will be Mayor, the vice chairman Deputy Mayor. The new chains of office and regalia are being sponsored by Businesses in the District. The updated logo will be sent to PAs so that Service Unit electronic, letterheads, faxes and memos can be amended immediately.

From Monday, 12th March, the new name Wokingham Borough Council will be used and the Council's website and electronic letterheads etc will be updated. Signage, publications and stationery will be replaced over time, with old stocks being used up before any new supplies are printed.
