#### Hurst Horticultural Show Saturday 21st August

The 86<sup>th</sup> Annual Hurst Horticultural Show opens to the public at 1.30pm on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> August in the Village Hall and grounds. For those wishing to enter produce, food items, crafts, handiwork or photography, schedules are available from all village shops. Entries close at 6pm on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> August so there is still time to measure your onions and polish your apples. Exhibits must be staged between 7 and 10.30am on Saturday morning, as judging starts promptly at 10:30.

The show is a truly traditional village event. When the hall, marquees and grounds open, the spectacle of colourful produce is a real delight. Helping to make the afternoon more enjoyable there will be craft and plant stalls, teas, bar and food with music from the Jeez Cook Jazz Trio.

In the adjacent field, the Exemption Dog Show offer classes for both pedigree and novelty canine entrants. Dog show entries are only accepted on the field from 11.30am and judging starts at 12 noon. This year proceeds will go to Bellmead Kennels, Old Windsor (The Country Annexe of Battersea Dogs Home).

On the Martineau village green opposite, Children's sports will start at 2.30; again entries will only be taken on the field. That is of course after the children have checked their entries for prizes in the junior's section of the show. There are classes for three age groups with four classes in each section. Four trophies will be awarded in the children's classes, one for each age group and an overall champion for the competitor who gains the most points.

Trophies for the winners of all classes will be awarded at 4.30pm and this is followed by an auction of the produce not removed from the show, rounding off a truly enjoyable afternoon in Hurst.

### **Planning News**

Good news! The Inspector has delivered his verdict on the Hicks Persimmon application to build 250 houses on the Sandford Farm infill site, and has said, for all the right reasons, that it should not be allowed. However, the saga continues, with The Oracle Corporation applying to build a corporate training centre, including a 250 bedroom hotel for residential courses. Their proposal would not involve transporting the putrescing rubbish across the Loddon into Hurst – an improvement on the previous application – but would nevertheless have a strong impact on the westward view from Hurst and, importantly, build on land designated as agricultural and outside settlement boundaries. If the local plans are to mean anything, they mean that development should not take place here! Both the Parish Council and The Society are opposing it.



Many people have expressed concern at the proposal to divert Footpath No 9, which runs from opposite the Green Man to the corner of Hogmoor Lane, and, at the same time, to "upgrade" part of it to a bridleway. We believe that the bridleway proposal would be of no practical benefit to riders, while causing a traffic hazard at a narrow part of busy Hinton Road. One of the attractions of the existing diagonal route across the field is the sense of open space, and the proposed diversion would take this away. We think that most of landowner's legitimate concerns could be met in other ways, without moving a right of way which has been there for over 250 years.

The Society has expressed its concern to the Chairman of the Highways Sub-committee of WDC, which met on 22nd July to consider the proposal. The next step is for formal notice of the proposal to be posted, in the local press, and at both ends of the footpath. Formal objections should then be sent to WDC within 28 days.
